AMS DOCUMENTARY RECEIVES FLYING COLORS

Booklist and World War II Magazine give *Flying for Freedom* rave reviews

Dallas, TX – AMS Pictures' *Flying for Freedom* continues to receive high marks, this time from *Booklist* and *WWII Magazine*. As part of the *Black History Uncovered Series*, this documentary exposes the lost stories of African American Tuskegee Airmen who fought as heroes for their country, only to return home to the same segregation and unequal experience before the war.

Writer Candace Smith, of *Booklist Magazine* describes *Flying for Freedom* as “a moving historical account of valor, determination, and courage...an inspiring account of an overlooked group of heroes.”

Richard R Muller, writer of *World War II Magazine*, says that the film is a well-paced selection of interviews with surviving airmen and their family members. “The heart of the video is the engaging interviews with the veterans. Production values on the DVD are excellent, with many outstanding contemporary photographs and film clips.
